- <sup>2</sup> As part of their scheduled academic progress, third-year students in the part-time program are required to complete Professional Responsibility. Professional Responsibility is also open to students in the full-time division who have completed their second year. Priority will be given to third-year part-time students.
- <sup>3</sup> Externships are open to students who have satisfactorily completed all first year courses, are in good academic standing, and have a grade point average of at least a 2.00. - <sup>4</sup> Advanced standing required. Advanced standing requires completion of the first year of the full-time division and the second year of the part-time division.
