

Job Description

Atlanta's John Marshall Law School is seeking to hire one or more full-time, visiting Legal Writing Instructors to teach Legal Research, Analysis & Writing to first-year law students beginning August 1, 2024. This will be a nine-month (August 1, 2024 – May 31, 2025), non-tenure-track appointment with the possibility of becoming a long term contract or tenured. The Legal Writing Instructor will be responsible for teaching two sections of Legal Research, Analysis & Writing I in the fall semester and two sections of Legal Research, Analysis & Writing II in the spring semester.

Ideal Experience and Qualifications

• Applicants must have a J.D. degree.

• Applicants must also have at least two years of experience in law practice or a judicial clerkship or law school teaching or tutoring experience.

• The ideal candidate should also have a record of outstanding academic achievement in law school; excellent analytical, research, writing, and interpersonal skills; and teaching or tutoring experience.

• Candidates should also demonstrate a commitment to teaching legal writing.
